## PUBLICATION POLICY & EDITORIAL ETHICS

**The Journal of Integrated Research Frontiers (JIRF)**, published by *Cerebral Publication Private Limited*, is dedicated to supporting the timely dissemination of robust, rigorous, and strictly peer-reviewed original literature across diverse academic domains. As an international, multidisciplinary online platform launched in 2026 under the editorial guidance of Chief Editor Dr. Manoj Kumar, the journal adheres to rigorous criteria ensuring scientific integrity, absolute transparency, and ethical excellence.

All stakeholders involved in the publishing workflow—including authors, editorial boards, peer reviewers, and corporate managers—are strictly required to comply with established standards of publication ethics and best practices as outlined below.

### 1. General Editorial Mandate & Scope

The Journal of Integrated Research Frontiers welcomes scholarly contributions across a wide, multidisciplinary paradigm. Submitted documents must constitute reports of original research that significantly enhance empirical or conceptual insights. Manuscripts submitted to JIRF are evaluated based on structural merit, methodologies, and scholarly implications, without regard to the authors' institutional ranking, geographical region, or demographic traits.

### 2. Author Roles, Representation, and Liabilities

Submission of a manuscript implies that all designated authors have actively participated in the research design, data acquisition, or analysis and have collectively authorized the final layout of the manuscript.

- Consensual Agreement:** Every contributing author must review and agree to the research report before submission. By providing the manuscript, the authors certify that the corresponding author possesses formal authorization to act on their behalf in all matters concerning the peer review, metadata validation, and publication processing of the manuscript by JIRF.

- **Originality and Source Tracking:** Authors are expected to ensure that the manuscript is entirely their original work. Every external data set, quote, or analytical method utilized must be recognized with proper citations and clear acknowledgments. The underlying original source data must be securely retained and available for evaluation by the Chief Editor or editorial referees upon official request.
- **Accountability:** All authors assume public, ethical accountability for the complete contents of the paper.

### 3. Exclusivity and Dual Submission Guidelines

By submitting an abstract or text to JIRF, authors formally guarantee that they hold the legal authority to publish the work. They explicitly certify that the manuscript, or any papers with substantially identical content, has not been published previously and is not under consideration for publication by any other journal or repository.

Dual or parallel submissions are strictly prohibited. Should a related study be currently under evaluation or published elsewhere, the authors must explicitly declare this to the Chief Editor upon submission, detailing how the new submission remains distinctly novel.

#### **Mandatory Covering Letter Requirement:**

*When submitting papers for publication to the Journal of Integrated Research Frontiers, authors are required to provide a formal written assurance in an accompanying covering letter. This statement must explicitly outline the specific elements of novelty, unique investigative pathways, or cross-disciplinary benefits introduced by their research.*

### 4. Peer Review Policy & Procedures

To preserve technical excellence, JIRF implements a double-blind peer review framework wherein the identities of authors and reviewers remain mutually anonymous.

1. **Initial Editorial Screening:** All submitted drafts are scanned by the Chief Editor and editorial managers for alignment with guidelines, proper structure, formatting, and standard originality thresholds.
2. **Refereed Evaluation:** Qualified manuscripts are routed to a minimum of two independent domain reviewers. Evaluation criteria focus on systematic design, depth of literary analysis, scientific ethics, and general relevance.
3. **Final Verdict Authority:** The Chief Editor, Dr. Manoj Kumar, retains absolute executive authority regarding the ultimate acceptance, revision request, or rejection of any submission.

### 5. Ethical Conduct, Research Integrity, and Compliance

JIRF maintains zero tolerance for scientific misconduct, including data fabrication, image manipulation, and plagiarism.

### **Plagiarism and Redundant Publication**

All submissions undergo validation using professional text-matching systems. Substantial replication of text, paraphrased ideas without citation, or self-plagiarism will result in immediate rejection or subsequent retraction if discovered after online publication.

### **Human and Animal Rights**

For studies involving clinical observation or biological test subjects, authors must verify that all investigations were conducted in compliance with relevant institutional or national review protocols. Evidence of formal approval from appropriate ethics committees must be embedded within the text.

### **Conflicts of Interest**

Authors must explicitly report any institutional, financial, or personal obligations that could be perceived as inappropriately biasing their findings or conclusions.
